Message from the Mayor

Hi Basehor!

Can you believe that we are already a month into 2024?

As we wrap up the holiday season, I wanted to take this opportunity to thank some very important individuals who were instrumental in helping me make the holidays special for children in our community. Thanks to the combined efforts from our Basehor Police Department and the local school counselors and principals, we were able to identify 33 students whose families needed assistance to help purchase their children presents for the holidays. Through the Mayor's Charity Fund, we were able to adopt the 33 children from Unified School District 458 and were able to purchase approximately \$250 in presents for each child.

I could not be more appreciative of the generosity shown by everyone who helped with this huge undertaking, and it was such a joy to get to spread Christmas cheer to those children.

The presents were able to be purchased through the Mayor's Charity Fund, which benefits local non-profit organizations and charities, and is solely generated by revenues created through fundraising. The Mayor's Annual Golf Tournament is the primary fundraising event for the Mayor's Charity Fund.

Thanks to the fundraising efforts of the Mayor's Charity Fund, I was also able to provide financial support to the family of a young child in our community who suffers from a rare disease and requires frequent medical care, including chemotherapy.

I look forward to once again hosting the Mayor's Annual Golf Tournament on September 18, 2024, to benefit the Mayor's Charity Fund and a number of worthy causes in our community.

Paving for Progress

We are very excited to announce the start of "Paving for Progress!" This five-year program is designed to modernize and improve the City of Basehor's streets that are in need of repair.

Basehor residents may have noticed curb repairs began in 2023 for certain areas, and additional roadway and curb improvements are scheduled to continue throughout 2024.

In the 2019 City of Basehor Citizen Satisfaction Survey, the condition of the City's streets was identified as the third highest priority for improvement. In January of 2022, the City's Governing Body authorized the Basehor Complete Street Inventory



Better Connectivity Coming Soon

At the Jan. 24, 2024 City Council meeting, the Governing Body officially signed the awards from the Kansas Department of Transportation (KDOT) to move forward with the 155th Street and MetroGreen Trail Projects.



These improvement projects will enhance overall safety for both motorists and non-motorists, adding turning lanes, sidewalks, and walking trails. Combined, the construction is estimated to cost \$13.2 million, with more than \$8 million of the costs being covered by grants that have been awarded to the City.

Construction is scheduled to begin in the upcoming months and is part of Basehor Connected, an ongoing community trans-



portation improvement initiative.

Project. This initiative called for the inventory and assessment of all Basehor streets to create a long-term maintenance and improvement plan to support current infrastructure as well as accommodate future growth.

Following the assessments of each street, a 5-year pavement management plan was then created that would not only provide for the reconstruction of poor and failed roads, but would also include maintenance for good-rated streets to preserve them and prolong their life span.

The City of Basehor's Governing Body has authorized funding for years 1 and 2, permitting \$2.4 million in road and curb improvements. These improvements began with curb repairs that were completed at the end of 2023 and will continue with street and curb repairs that will take place throughout 2024. Years 3-5 would have been funded if the 1% general citywide sales tax had been approved in June 2023. Since the vote for the 1% general citywide sales tax did not pass, the budget currently includes modest roadway improvements over a longer period of time than the proposed 5-Year Pavement Management Plan.

An online interactive map will be coming soon that will demonstrate each street's rating and also identify which streets are scheduled for improvements. More information on the interactive map and where to view it will be shared in the coming weeks.

Chief's Corner

Happy January, Basehor!

With the recent winter storms we received, I wanted to take this opportunity to share some winter driving safety tips to help keep everyone safe while driving during inclement weather.

- Roads, especially overpasses, can still be slick even if there is no snow on the ground.
- It is recommended to have an emergency kit in your vehicle that includes a warm blanket, extra socks, a protein bar or energy snack, a working flashlight and drinking water.
- Snow accumulation on your vehicle should be completely brushed off before you drive the vehicle. You should not drive your vehicle if any of the front windshield or side windows have blocked visibility due to snow accumulation. It is recommended to use a broom to sweep the snow off the entire vehicle before it is operated.
- Drive for everyone else. Even though you have taken the steps to ensure a safe arrival in this frigid weather it doesn't mean everyone else has. Be attentive and aware of your surroundings as there are other drivers sharing the roadways.

Remember, be nice, be kind, and be polite.

Sidewalk Snow Removal

Welcome to our second installment of our section, Codes Component. We would like to take this opportunity to share with you some helpful information regarding snow and ice removal.

Did you know that in most cases in the City of Basehor, it is the adjoining property owner's responsibility to clear the sidewalks after a snow or ice event? This is outlined in Basehor's Municipal Code. All trails and multi-use paths will be plowed by the City.

The code states that sidewalks should be treated by either/and/or removing the snow; sprinkling the sidewalk with sand, ashes, or other noncorrosive chemicals within 12 hours from the time that the snow or ice storm has stopped.

If the sidewalk is not cleared so that it is deemed reasonably safe for a pedestrian to travel, the sidewalk could possibly be treated by the city and charged to the individuals.

We hope everyone stays safe as we experience this winter weather, and as always please contact City Hall if you have any questions.
