

**ORDINANCE FOR ADOPTION OF THE 2002 NATIONAL ELECTRICAL CODE
ORDINANCE NO. 509**

An ordinance of the **City of Basehor** adopting the 2002 edition of the National Electrical Code, regulating and governing the design, construction, quality of materials, erection, installation, alteration, repair, location, relocation, replacement, addition to, use or maintenance of electrical systems in the **City of Basehor**; providing for the issuance of permits and collection of fees therefore; repealing Ordinance No. 292 of the City of Basehor and all other ordinances and parts of the ordinances in conflict therewith. The City Council of the City of Basehor does ordain as follows:

Section 1: That a certain document, three (3) copies of which are on file in the office of the City Clerk of the City of Basehor, being marked and designated as the National Electrical Code, 2002 edition, as published by the National Fire Protection Association, be and is hereby adopted as the Electrical Code of the City of Basehor, in the State of Kansas regulating and governing the design, construction, quality of materials, erection, installation, alteration, repair, location, relocation, replacement, addition to, use or maintenance of electrical systems as herein provided; providing for the issuance of permits and collection of fees therefore; and each and all of the regulations, provisions, penalties, conditions and terms of said Electrical Code on file in the office of the City of Basehor are hereby referred to, adopted, and made a part hereof, as if fully set out in this ordinance, with the additions, insertions, deletions and changes, if any, prescribed in Section 2 of this ordinance.

Section 2: The following sections are hereby revised: Article 210-12 is deleted and Article 230-70.

Section 3: That Ordinance No. 292 of the City of Basehor entitled the 1993 National Electrical Code and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 4: That if any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional and such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The City Council hereby declares that it would have passed this ordinance, and each section, subsection, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses and phrases be declared unconstitutional.

Section 5: That nothing in this ordinance or in the Electrical Code hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding impending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby repealed as cited in Section 2 of this ordinance; nor shall any just or legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this ordinance.

Section 6: That the City Clerk; is hereby ordered and directed to cause this ordinance to be published.

Section 7: That this ordinance and the rules, regulations, provisions, requirements, orders and matters established and adopted hereby shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and publication as required by law.
